Founded in 1964, Seabury Hall is a coeducational independent day school. Located on the rural slopes of Haleakala on Maui, the school draws students, grades 6-12, from all over the island, and its student body reflects Hawaii's ethnic, cultural, and socio-economic diversity.

Mission

Seabury Hall is an independent school affiliated with the Episcopal Church designed to: prepare students for successful college and university work; move students to develop mind, body, and soul; cause students to realize their responsibility to community.

- 41% of Upper School students identify as non-caucasian.
- Upper School gender breakdown: 53% female & 47% males.
- 40% of Upper School students participate in the performing arts.

- 98.7% of the Class of 2017 are attending four-year colleges or universities.

Academics

The curriculum is college-preparatory with an emphasis on the traditional subjects of English, history, laboratory science, mathematics, and world language.

Rank, Transcript, & GPA Calculation

- Seabury Hall does not rank.
- Non-Seabury Hall courses will not be listed on the transcript.
- GPA is cumulative for grades 9-11. A recalculated GPA that includes first semester of the 12th grade will be included with Mid Year Reports.

Grading Scale & Weighting Policy

- Seabury Hall uses a standard 4.0 grading system.
- Honors and Advanced Placement classes are awarded a .3 bonus.

Academic Honors

- Head of School List: 3.7 and above; Honors List: 3.3 - 3.69.

AP & Honors Courses

- Seabury Hall students are encouraged to take an appropriately rigorous course load. Students are counseled to take no more than two AP or Honors courses at a time.
- Most AP courses require specific prerequisites/placement exam, minimum GPAs, and/or departmental approval.
- 16 AP courses offered (AP English courses are offered as an additional semester no credit course. Students are given an "E" for "Excellent" if they attended all of the classes and produced quality work.)
- 11 Honors courses offered
